The Department of Geological Sciences and Geological Engineering at Queen's University requests applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching the following undergraduate courses in the winter term of the 2009-2010 academic year.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. A suitably qualified candidate who is a graduate student at Queen's teaching a course in their discipline is eligible for appointment as a **Teaching Fellow** during the period of their employment. If the graduate student is teaching a course in a different discipline then they would be eligible for appointment as a **Term Adjunct**.
